Dear parents, children, staff and parishioners,



This week has certainly been a busy one! I have loved spending some time with the children in their classrooms, witnessing how hard they have all been working and enjoying discussing the wonderful work they have produced! These have been completed so that we are able to fully support the children in the next stages of their learning and plan a series of lessons that fully meet their needs. Holy Week

Holy Week begins on Sunday and we are preparing to embark on our own spiritual journey with Jesus as he takes up his cross. To mark this within school we are creating our own Stations of the Cross Virtual Reflection. Each class are leading us through the stations which incorporate tableaus, readings and prayers. We also have some lovely songs recorded from Early Years and Key Sage 1 and a Sacred Dance performed by Key Stage 2. The reflection will be shared via an online link so that you can watch it as a family if you wish to. On Thursday, we will also be holding rolling worship. The hall will be transformed into a poignant place in which children are reminded of the events of Holy Week and sacrifice Jesus had to endure.


