Nursery continue to amaze us! They are our youngest children but still achieve so much. They also made bread this week and carefully followed instructions and worked together to ensure that they got this right.

Year 2 have had some wonderful learning experiences this half term. Miss Bereza has been working hard to plan active learning experiences that allow our Year 2 children to learn without a pen or paper in sight! These have included dramatizing the Pentecost story, complete with flame headpieces; developing their understanding of biodiversity by participating in an eco-walk and they also performed their Mousike Ensemble performance pieces to their family and friends in a wonderful class assembly!

A beautiful mass was held to celebrate this special occasion and the children performed a poignant Sacred Dance to remind the congregation of their newly strengthened relationship with Jesus




We look forward to seeing what the last half term of this academic year will bring when we return to school on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> June!
