

# St Gregory's Value of Catholic Primary School



Nursery continue to amaze us! They are our youngest children but still achieve so much. They have been enjoying reading 'Jasper's Beanstalk' this half term and have enjoyed the creative opportunities that this unit of work has brought them. They have also been fantastic scientists and have studied the life cycles — they have loved having tadpoles in their environment!

whole school celebrations too – wearing red, white and blue and enjoying ice cream in the sun!







#### Holiday Requests

Please may I remind you that our school policy makes it clear that we do not authorise term time holidays. Can I encourage you to plan any holidays around school breaks and not to take children out of school during term time. Every day that your child attends school is very important. Please remember if you proceed with an unauthorised holiday, the Local Authority may be informed and issue a Penalty Notice. This is currently £60 per parent per child, to be paid within 21 days (the fine doubles to £120 per parent per child after 21 days). We do hope that you will continue to work in partnership with us.

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
