Holiday Request

Please may I remind you that our school policy makes it clear that we **do not** authorise term time holidays. Can I encourage you to plan any holidays around school breaks and **not** to take children out of school during term time. Every day that your child attends school is very important. Please remember if you proceed with an unauthorised holiday, the Local Authority may be informed and issue a Penalty Notice. This is currently £60 per parent per child, to be paid within 21 days (the fine doubles to £120 per parent per child after 21 days). We do hope that you will continue to work in partnership with us.




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Matters Arising

Internet Safety - Social Media Workshop for Parents

Unfortunately, we are seeing a rise in the number of concerns our children our raising regarding social media forums that they are using outside of school. Many of the children are using apps such as Instagram, Whastapp & Tik Tok (but to name a few), and sadly a small number of our children are using these inappropriately to make unkind comments and view/share inappropriate content. Please do rest assured that if there are any concerns regarding your child, you will be contacted by a member of staff to discuss these with you directly and we are also working to support children who are affected by any issues involving social media.

Our PSHE curriculum and Computing Curriculum also includes schemes of work around e-safety and how to stay safe online, so that we can educate children on the correct steps to take should they encounter an issue, but also teach them how to use the internet safely too. I would like to remind you that many of the apps the children are using have a minimum age limit of 13 and we would really relish your support, as parents and carers, in monitoring what the children are accessing. To support with your role as Parents and Carers in managing this issue, Coventry Police are running a Social Media Workshop for Parents – the details are below if you are interested in joining. Thank you for your support regarding this – if you have any further concerns, please do not hesitate to speak with your child's class teacher.

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
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<u>hool Fete – Friday 23rd June</u>

Can you help us find raffle prizes? If you are able to help us source prizes / vouchers for the raffle, please let us know.



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
