


Dear parents, children, staff and parishioners,

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

Please may I just remind you, that we do not authorise holidays in term time. Whilst we

appreciate that holidays during the school term are cheaper, we are unable to approve any holidays unless there are exceptional circumstances (where evidence will be requested). For all requests for leave you must complete the appropriate form (available from the school office). Failure to do so will result in a safeguarding concern being raised, which in turn will trigger a home visit being conducted. This may then result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued if it has been determined that you have been on holiday.

<u>Matters Arising</u>

If you have a concern about your child, please book an appointment to discuss with your child's class teacher by either phoning or emailing the Office to make an appointment. In the first instance – the class teacher is the first port of call. If an issue arises and it is not resolved, the next step is to see the Leader of Learning. If a matter is then not resolved – an appointment can be made with a member of the Leadership team – Assistant Principal (Mrs Priest), Associate Principal (Mrs Scullion) or Executive Principal (Mrs Williams).

This is the procedure, and all staff will direct parents through these steps as they have been found as the most efficient way to resolve concerns. Leaders of Learning have the responsibility to lead their 'mini-school' and they work hard to make their phase the very best it can be.

Nut-Free School

We are a nut free school. We have several children in school, with severe life-threatening nut allergies. Please do not send any food to school that contains nut – this includes cereal bars, chocolate, cakes etc. Nut butters, such as peanut butter, almond butter and chocolate-nut spreads are also not allowed. Any product containing nuts will be immediately confiscated.
