Punctuality and Persistent Lateness

Please remember that school starts at 8:50am and registers are taken promptly. It is really important that children arrive to school on time to avoid disrupting the class and teacher once the morning lesson has begun.

Whilst we understand that on certain occasions lateness cannot be helped, we ask that persistent lateness is avoided. We find that attending school and being on time supports the children in making great progress.

We monitor attendance and punctuality closely at school and you may be asked to come in to discuss your child's attendance if they are regularly late or absent. Persistent absence/lateness could result in a fine from the Local Authority.

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


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Save the Date - World Book Day

Matters Arising

If you have a concern about your child, please book an appointment to discuss with your child's class teacher by either phoning or emailing the Office to make an appointment. In the first instance — the class teacher is the first port of call. If an issue arises and it is not resolved, the next step is to see the Leader of Learning. If a matter is then not resolved — an appointment can be made with a member of the Leadership team — Assistant Principal (Mrs Priest), Associate Principal (Mrs Scullion) or Executive Principal (Mrs Williams).

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


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
